\*Students who plan to transfer to the UoM must complete at least one fine arts under the Humanities & Fine Arts general education requirement. Students planning to transfer to MTSU can take an approved Anthropology course in either the Humanities & Fine Arts or in an Area of Emphasis.

\*Students who intend to transfer to TTU should take POLS 1030 American Government

\*Students who intend to transfer to UTK should take 6 credit hours of a non-U.S. History sequence to fulfill the History requirement. Students who intend to transfer to UTM should take a U.S. History sequence to fulfill the History requirement.

\*Students who plan to transfer to UTM or UTK are encouraged to take the BIOL1110/1120 sequence.

\*Students who intend to transfer to UTK and UTM should take MATH 1530 or above to fulfill the Math requirement.

\*Students planning to transfer to the UoM will need to complete six hours of a 2000 level or higher foreign language to earn the Bachelor of Arts degree. Students who plan to transfer to UTK will be required to demonstrate intermediate-level competency in Foreign Language before graduating from UTK.

\*Students may demonstrate intermediate-level competence after transferring to UTK. Check with your advisor for recommended courses when selecting guided electives.
