The Mary Elizabeth Williams Endowed Scholarship is made possible as a result of a generous gift made to the Nashville State Community College Foundation by the Williams family. This scholarship was established to expand access to higher education through a flexible scholarship to support students who do not qualify for financial aid while attending Nashville State Community College. Each recipient is awarded up to \$1,000 per academic year. The number of awards made each year is dependent on the amount of funds in the endowment earnings account. Funds can be used to assist with tuition and fees.

To apply, please submit your NSCC Financial Aid and Scholarship Form through your myNSCC. You must complete this application each year. We recommend that you submit your form early. Scholarships are awarded to qualified applicants on a first-come, first-awarded basis until funds are expended. Awards will be made contingent upon available funding.

This scholarship is awarded to qualified applicants based on the following criteria:

- Applicants must be pursuing an Associate Degree or Technical Certificate.
- Applicants must be enrolled in a minimum of six credit hours.
- If an applicant is a first-time freshman, applicant must have a minimum 2.0 high school grade point average.
- If applicant has previously completed college-level coursework, applicant must have earned a 2.0 cumulative grade point average.
- Applicants must be in good academic standing and meet satisfactory academic progress standards, as measured for federal Title IV Programs.

Students who receive the Mary Elizabeth Williams Endowed Scholarship in the fall semester must maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 and complete six credit hours to remain eligible for the spring disbursement of the scholarship.

Applicable maintenance fee/tuition refunds will be credited to the scholarship except in cases when the student is also receiving federal Title IV benefits and totally withdraws. In such cases, the refund is credited back to the appropriate program(s) according to the NSCC "Return of Title IV Funds" Policy.
