Pete Faison Endowed Scholarship

The Pete Faison Endowed Scholarship is made possible as a result of a generous gift made to the Nashville State Community College Foundation by the family of Pete Faison. This scholarship was established to expand access to higher education through flexible scholarship support for students with demonstrated financial need attending Nashville State Community College. Each recipient is awarded a maximum of the equivalent of 6 credit hours per semester, not to exceed \$1,000 per academic year. Funds can be used to assist with tuition and fees. Awards will be made contingent upon available funding.

To apply, please submit your NSCC Financial Aid and Scholarship Form through your myNSCC. You must complete this application each year. We recommend that you submit your form early. Scholarships are awarded to qualified applicants on a first-come, first-awarded basis until funds are expended. Awards will be made contingent upon available funding.

This scholarship is awarded to qualified applicants based on the following criteria:

- Applicants must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
- Applicants must be pursuing an Associate Degree or Technical Certificate majoring in Computer Technology.
- Applicants must be enrolled in a minimum of six credit hours.
- Applicants must have and maintain at minimum of 2.0 GPA.
- Applicants should provide a 250 word essay stating current career aspirations and motivational factors that pushed them to enroll at Nashville State. Applicants can submit this information through a pre-recorded video if preferred.
- Applicants must be in good academic standing and meet satisfactory academic progress standards, as measured for federal Title IV Programs.

Students who receive the Pete Faison Endowed Scholarship in the fall semester must maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 and complete six credit hours to remain eligible for the spring disbursement of the scholarship.

Applicable maintenance fee/tuition refunds will be credited to the scholarship except in cases when the student is also receiving federal Title IV benefits and totally withdraws. In such cases, the refund is credited back to the appropriate program(s) according to the NSCC "Return of Title IV Funds" Policy.
